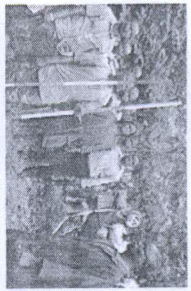

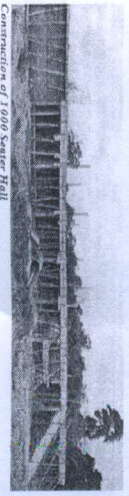
PHD DEGREE AWARD



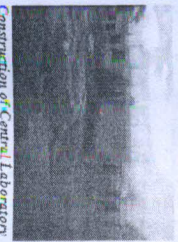
