Focus: This journal is focused on Research and Development along the value chain of all tree crops.

Types of paper accepted in this journal

- I. **Original research papers:** These include papers that contain empirical data which have not been published elsewhere earlier, except as an abstract, and their contents should not exceed 5000 words including abstract, tables and figures.
- II. **Review papers:** Although these papers will not contain empirical data obtained by the authors, but should contain discussion of published research papers and data acquired in specific areas. The length of Review papers should not exceed 6000 words (including references, figures and/or tables).

Word Process Format and Layout

Language: English

Line spacing: 1.5

Font type: Times New Roman

Font size: 12

Paragraphing: Block

Page column: Single column

Margin: 2.5 cm

First level headings: Bold, initials of proper nouns in upper case letters

Second level headings: Bold and italicized, with initials of proper nouns in upper case letters.

Manuscript Organization

All manuscripts are expected to be prepared as a single MS Word document with the complete text, tables, figures and references included. Manuscripts must be prepared using “in-text citations” for example ... (Olasupo *et al.*, 2023; Gavazzi and Adu, 2025).

Title Page: The manuscript title page presentation must be using the following specifications:

Manuscript title: Bold letters; Font 14; Sentence case

Author(s): First name, other names or initials followed by Surname. Multiple authors should be separated with comma sign.

Author affiliations: Superscript numbers on authors name should be used on authors with different organization addresses

Corresponding author: Email address of corresponding author

Abstract: Maximum of 250 words; Font 10

Keywords: Maximum of 5 keywords.

Introduction: This should provide an adequate background to the study and should end with the main objective of the research work. Where specific objective (s) are different from the main objective, they should be itemized at the end of the introduction, before ‘Materials and Methods’

Materials and Methods/Research Methodology: They include: Experimental location (s); detailed experimental procedures and analyses.

Results and Discussion: Results narrations or texts should precede all tables and figures. Table title should be at the top of each table, while figure title should be at the foot of each figure. All figures or photographs must be very clear, without grid lines and submitted as jpg or tiff files with distinct characters and symbols at 500 dpi (dots per inch). Test your figures by printing them from a personal computer. The online version should look relatively similar to the personal-printer copy. Tables and equations should be in an editable rather than image version. Tables must be edited with Word/Excel and presented with top and bottom border lines but without inner border lines. Equations must be edited with Equation Editor. Figures, tables and equations should be numbered and cited as Figure 1, Figure 2, Figure 3, etc. in sequence.

Discussion should be clear and concise, exploring the significance of the results of the work, not repeat them. The main conclusions and recommendations of the study may be presented in a short Conclusions section, which may stand alone or form a subsection of a Discussion or Results and Discussion section.

Conclusion: The main conclusions and recommendations of the study may be presented in a short section, which may stand alone or form a subsection of a Discussion or Results and Discussion section.

Acknowledgement(s): Collate acknowledgements in a separate section at the end of the article before the references. Do not include acknowledgements on the title page, as a footnote to the title or otherwise. List here those individuals who provided help during the research (e.g., funding, providing language help, writing assistance or proof reading the article, etc.).

Conflict of Interest: Author(s) must declare if there is any conflict of interest in the manuscript to be published.

The Editor prepares a decision letter according to the comments of the reviewers, which is sent to the corresponding author. All non-reviewed manuscripts are sent back within 10 days and decisions.
